The Genealogy group met on Wednesday, October 21, at the extension center. We had 3 visitors and 13 members present. After our pledge to the flags President Jan Beattie presented her October Quick Tip which covered information on the 1890 US Veteran Schedule, which can be used to help fill in for the destroyed 1890 US Federal Census. This tip can be found on our website: www.ohcegenealogy.com.

Our speaker was Sydney Clinton Holt, who followed up his September presentation about finding his great great grandfather's grave with the details of how he hit a brick wall on that great-great-grandfather and could not find out who was his father. Using DNA, the internet and help from a researcher exploring their own slave ancestor he was able to locate a will that named this great-great grandfather as his son. That gave him the link he needed to break through that wall and connect his family to three more generations and back to England. It was interesting to see the transcribed will of one of his descendants that listed three pages of inventory including furniture, livestock and, as found in many southern states during the 1700's, slaves. Mr. Holt also gave an interesting side talk about Fort Sill, and it's history.

Our group will meet next on Thursday, November19th to hear a presentation on "Using Ancestry.com".

Twice a year, your school will receive a check and can use that cash to buy whatever it needs. For a complete list of participating products visit: BTFE.com. When your cash register receipt is scanned, ten cents will automatically be given credit for participating products.

You will need to have set up a Landing Page with Username, Password, and Sign in which it will remember each time you scan in a receipt in the Box Tops Family Sharing program.

More recently, in 2018 and 2020, she donated her grandmother's beautiful 1911 bowl for workshops and leader lessons on Depression and Carnival Glass.
