THE GENEALOGY GROUP

The Genealogy Group met Wednesday, September 16th, at the Extension Center. We also invited people to join via ZOOM. Following our pledge to the flags, Jan Beattie read her Quick Tips on colonial slang terms. Those were quite interesting and can be found on our website. We learned of the passing of one of our members, Betty Geis passed at the age of 100 years and 9 months. As our custom, we will donate books to the Oklahoma History Center in her memory.

Our speaker was Sidney Clinton Holt. He inherited some papers from his family and read a description of an old cemetery where his great-great grandfather was most likely buried and wanted to find that cemetery. He traveled to the area and began talking to people who had lived in that region all their lives. That eventually led him to several people who remembered an old cemetery beside an old house. The house was gone and there was now no indication of a cemetery until a resident pointed out a flat stone in the middle of some trees and told him that was the old cemetery. Another person led him to what was left of the foundation of the old house, which turned out to be the house his great-great grandfather had built in 1834.

His family received permission to restore the cemetery and using cement markers they were able to mark 7 places that they believe were the resting places of his family. There are plans to find more graves through dousing. The area was cleared and a sign put up for the HOLT CEMETERY with a chain around the boundaries. It was truly a labor of love and respect for that family's pioneers.

Next month, Mr. Holt will share some the research techniques he used to connect to different families through a shared ancestor.


